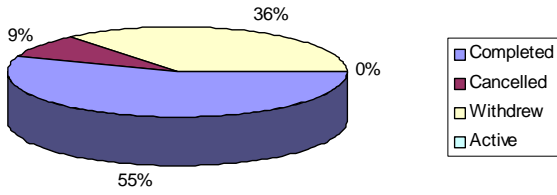


An ongoing part of the COOLSchool site improvement plan continues to focus on student completion rates. This last year we have invested heavily in getting a better handle on the data we collect and for the first time we are able to look at possible trends through this broad-brush stroke of raw registration numbers. The next step will be to add in qualitative survey data that we try to collect on students when they enter a course and when they exit through completion, or withdrawal. The charts in the left column include cancelled registrations; those students that signed up and cancel before starting any coursework. The charts in the right hand column do not include those numbers in the calculation. COOLSchool’s open registration policy gives students up to 10 months to complete their course work and as such it is only after 10 months from the date the last student signs up for a course that we can “close” the books for that school year. The chart at the bottom right lists 16% of regular Ed students as still active or progressing through their course work for the 2007/2008 academic year.

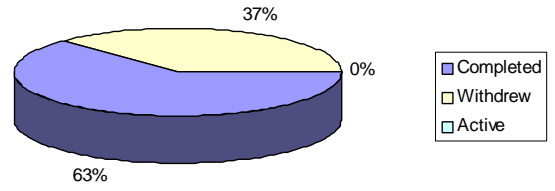
### Regular Education Courses



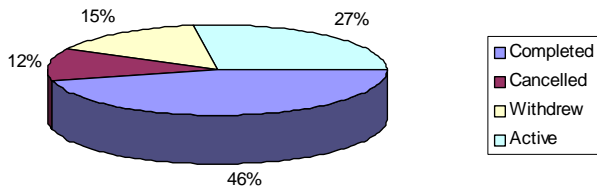
**2006/2007 School Year  
(Includes Cancelled Registrations)**



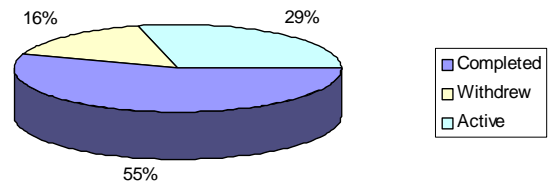
**2006/2007 School Year

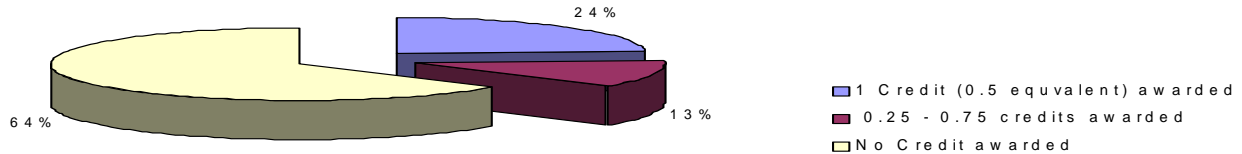
Program Logistics

- ✓ 2 sessions per day (10-12 AM and 12-2PM) M-TH for 5 weeks
- ✓ 30 station computer lab could handle up to 60 students a day
- ✓ No cost for free and reduced students, those not paid tuition
- ✓ 22 course offerings (English, Social Science, Math, Health)
- ✓ COOLSchool teachers were required to check-in every day
- ✓ A COOLSchool support personnel was on site one day a week

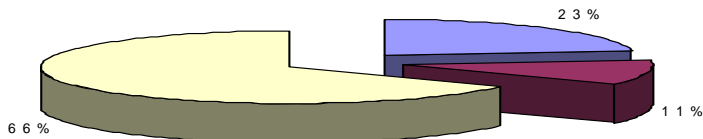
Student Expectations

- ✓ Attendance was required. (After 5 unexcused absences students received no credit.)
- ✓ Only credit deficient students qualified
- ✓ Students enrolled in courses recommended by counselors
- ✓ Students had to finish within the 5-week session

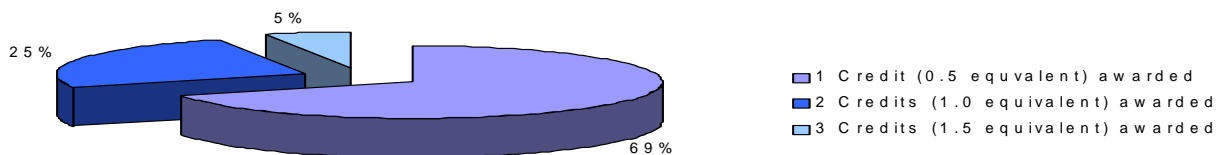
**Credit Summary - 2005 (72 students)**
